
By 2020, Partido Development Administration (PDA) envisions a district where the quality of life is comparable with the Lone district of the Province of Catanduanes.

ith both pride and humility, I take on the challenge to steer our organization towards our vision of becoming a district where the quality of life is comparable to the more advanced districts in the country.



The PWSS management has managed the operation despite the increasing number of concessionaires and maintenance requirements of the water systems. The management continually apply its quality service on the responsible use of water in Partido.






PWSS CONSUMERS IEC PROGRAM


TECHNICAL COMMITTEE MEETING



s mandated by Republic Act 7820, the Technical Committee is involved in the day-to-day operations of the PDA by serving as the technical arm of the PDA Board of Directors in planning and implementing transmunicipal projects. For the year 2015, the Technical Committee held meeting with guests from various agencies whose programs and projects cover the Partido municipalities.

The Technical Committee is composed of the ten Municipal Planning and Development Coordinators in Partido. It meets regularly to discuss plans and programs of the PDA, other government and non-government agencies and those of individual LGUs which may be replicated in other LGUs. As most of the plans and programs of the LGUs are conceptualized and implemented through the office of the MPDCs, their technical capabilities are highly regarded in project planning and implementation. Thus, their recommendations in PDA projects which require LGU inputs are critical in ensuring that the goals are achieved.

Last April 17, 2015 the Partido Development Administration together with the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS-DOST) conduct a Technical committee meeting discussing the Disaster Risk Reduction Program preparation in the Partido area. The meeting was participated by the Municipal Planning and Development Coordinators and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC)



PARTIDO WRAPS UP RABIES AWARENESS CARAVAN FOR 2015

n July 3, 2015, the Department of Health, in partnership with the Partido Development Administration (PDA), Department of Agriculture (DA), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the 10 LGUs from the fourth congressional district of Camarines Sur, conducted a district-wide advocacy on RA 9842, otherwise known as the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007.

The whole-day activity was participated in by the district's Municipal Health Officers, ABC Presidents, Municipal Agriculture Officers, Municipal Kagawad on Health from Partido. The Resource Speakers thoroughly discussed topics related to the prevention and management of the rabies disease.

At the end of the activity, the LGU participants and health program

partners agreed that there is a need to cascade the advocacy at the municipal level, with the end-in-view of enhancing the awareness of the general public on rabies, a fatal but preventable disease.

A follow-up meeting was conducted on July 24, 2015 to discuss the details of the municipal advocacies on rabies prevention and control. This meeting was attended by MHOs, Lo-

cal Government Operations Officers, Municipal Planning and Development Coordinators, PDA, DOH-PDO Camarines Sur and a representative from the Bicol Medical Center-Animal Bite Treatment Center. It was agreed that the Information-Education Campaign shall be conducted to help disseminate more information on responsible pet ownership and treatment and management of rabies.



The speakers and the participants agreed on the dates and the focal persons at the municipal activities. The cost of the district-wide advocacies was mutually agreed to be shared between the DOH, PDA and the LGUs. Dog vaccination was also made an integral part of the activity, depending on the request of the concerned LGUS, and was agreed to be conducted by the representatives from the Department of Agriculture ROV and the Municipal Agriculture Office...

The conduct of these municipal advocacies on the prevention and control of rabies further streamlined the partnership between the PDA, LGUs, and the DOH in the fight against rabies in Partido.

By the end of 2015, nine out of the ten municipalities in Partido were visited by the Caravan Team. The activity for Caramoan will be conducted in the first quarter of 2016.




To reinforce Partido's response against rabies, the establishment of three (3) ABTCs is being proposed, namely ABTC-Tigaon, ABTC-Caramoan, ABTC-Tinambac. This will help decrease the number of animal bite patients being referred and attended to at the BMC-ABTC, and will lessen the travel time and cost of the patients going to the said facility. The request has already been submitted by the PDA to the DOH, and has already received positive feedback. PDA shall closely monitor and follow-up on the progress of this request.

The target participants are Grades five and six pupils and the teachers in schools that have signified interest to have the MITC deployed in their respective schools.

For its 2015 deployment, the MITC served a total of 1,353 pupils, and 185 teachers.

The Partido State University provide IT Instructors to handle the MITC lessons for the participating schools.

The MITC module design highlights Basic literacy on computer software, hardware, use of internet and trouble shooting, with emphasis on using the basic used of Microsoft Word, Excel and Powerpoint.

Participants are subjected for the Pre-test and Post-test to asses their IT knowledge before and after the MITC lessons. This is an important evaluation tool for the MITC program.





Tourism master plan gets RDC support

The RDC endorsed the Lahuy-Atulayan Islands and Partido Environs Tourism Master Plan (TMP) through RDC Resolution No. 29 (S. 2015). The TMP aims to harness potentials for sustainable tourism development in the Partido area.

it covers the municipalities of Caramoan, Sagñay, Tigaon, San Jose, Lágonoy, Garchitorena, Presentacion, Tinanbac, Siruma and Goa, with a total of 290 barrapays. It also covers the how protected areas within the Parisdo area. Ith Isarog Natural Park and the Caramoan Natural Park. The TIMP includes proposed projects with total investment amounting to PhP 2.5 billion to be implamented in 10 years.

The proced projects are expected to: (a) enhance competitiveness of tourism products; (b) attract tourism-related investments on infrastructure, amentless and facilities; (c) educate stakeholders on technology-based income generating skill; (d) establish sustainable livelihood activities; (e) promote self-respect, cultural prise and dignity among stakeholders; (f) protect the environmental resources and tourism assets, (g) marinstream prodipiont or stakeholders in resource and tourism governance; (fi) develop a system and institutional arrangements for effective and efficient tourism industry management; and (i) increase stakeholders' resiliency against climate-related hazards.

RDC approves revalidated regional investment plan

The RDC 5 endorsed the revalidated Regional Development Investment Plan (RDIP) 2010–2018 freedy Resolution No. 33 (S. 2015). The RDIP is the translation of the development goals, objectives and strategies of the Bisco Regional Development Plan (RDIP) into viable public scotor programs, achieviles, and projects (PAPs) it provides the link between planning and budgeting and is the companion document of the Bisco RDP.







The revalidated RDIP is the source of PAPs for inclusion in the FY 2017 agency budget proposals and the basis of RDC budget review.








